## A MESSAGE FROM THE SR. WARDEN

Having just celebrated the Day of Pentecost, we were reminded of the rush of wind, which was the Holy Spirit, blowing through the place where the apostles were waiting. The Spirit brought new gifts and a lot of change, and many were confused because each person was speaking in their own language. But when they listened carefully, they realized that although the languages were different, somehow, through the grace of God, they were able to understand one another, and they were amazed.

We're kind of like those apostles, waiting, not always speaking the same language, and sometimes being confused. Some new things are happening with our service on the first Sunday of the month. The shape of our worship space in the parish hall is changing, our organist is changing, the choir is going on hiatus for the summer, we have had several new events with the fellowship dinners, and, of course, we are waiting for a new priest.

Change is often resisted because we can become anxious about the result, how it will affect us individually. But, change can be refreshing, renewing and strengthening.

It's easy to say that I would like to have My kind of service, with My kind of music, in the worship space I like, and at the time I want it to be.... but what about your neighbor? What about the other person who wants Trinity to meet all of the same requirements, but each of their requirements is different than those you prefer?

Sometimes we do speak different languages; traditional service, versus contemporary service; classic music versus praise music; worship in the parish hall, versus worship in the church, versus worship in the park; having both services exactly the same, versus offering different

styles of worship at different times; the "way things have always been done", versus trying something new.

This is a time when we have an opportunity to learn things outside our own frame of reference, to truly listen to one another, and through the grace of God, and the gifts of the Holy Spirit, we can learn to understand one another's language. We can try to use the wonderful gifts of Faith, Hope and Love, that we have been given, and in caring ways, each try to accommodate one another's needs and preferences.

We have been given specific directions to Love the Lord your God, to Love One Another, to take the Word of the Lord into the World, and to bring the World to Christ. These are the things that make us, hand in hand with one another, a church. If we simply follow those instructions and trust in God's strength and grace, as the winds of the Holy Spirit blow through Trinity and through our spirits, we will all be strengthened and renewed.

Please continue to keep Trinity, the Congregation, the Search Committee and our new priest in your daily prayers.

We have been collecting goodies for the Yulee Days "White Elephant Sale" and so far have quite an eclectic and fun assortment of items.

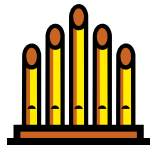
As usual during the summer we will be on hiatus and will meet again in September. Happy Summer!

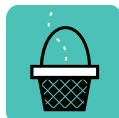

Sr. Warden, Alan Pankratz called the meeting to order at 7:00pm and Valerie Thomas opened with a prayer.

Alan thanked those who had come to the Service before the meeting with a special thank you to The Rev. Canon Gayanne Silver for celebrating Eucharist for us. He then welcomed and introduced Rev. Silver who will be Trinity's consultant to the Search Committee.

Canon Silver noted that she was not the "leader" but only to offer help and guidance.

The diocese will help by checking CV's, calling references and spreading the word for us. She congratulated George Bothwell, Treasurer on the excellent work he has done preparing information and budgeting for Trinity.

Canon Silver advised us that the Mission Board needs to look at all the ministries of the church and to be sure that all things are in order and the ministries each have what they need to fulfill their mission. We should be looking at ways to keep the members of the congregation together and to have celebrations often and keep up our good works. We might look at revising our website and we need to find appropriate words to describe who we are and what we need. Any areas of problem or difficulty should be addressed and cleared up before we call a new priest.

The search committee should find out "who" this parish is now, what is important to us, and what are our issues. The committee itself should know one another very well, listen to one another and learn about and from one another so you are able to value what each person is saying. You need to share all their feelings and ask all the questions you would like to ask. The most important thing is to Pray...Pray...Pray.

Everyone is asked to refrain from frequent questioning of the Search Committee about how things are going. Their work is confidential and they will make periodic reports to the Mission Board.

When the search nears conclusion the committee will present only one name to the Mission Board for approval.

The time table is uncertain although it will probably take from ten to fourteen months, but it will happen in God's time and in God's way.

Canon Silver went over the consultant's fee with us and is gifting us with a significant reduction in her fee for which Alan and the Board members thanked her.

Members of the Search Committee were thanked and, at 7:45pm, left the Mission Board meeting with Canon Silver to continue a meeting of their own.

The regular business of the Mission Board continued and Alan welcomed guests Jim Swarr and Joyce King to the meeting.

The minutes were read and reviewed and after a motion by Jim White and second by Jack Rice, were approved.

**Treasurer's Report**

Treasurer George Bothwell reported that our year to date finances look good. The money in the Priest Fund is low and needs to be collected. We need to remind everyone that the budgeted amount was based on a January start date.

We also need to request everyone to note on their check memo line what the check is for so it can be credited to the correct fund.

The surplus amount shown is not as high as reflected because we have just received our insurance bill for the year. Our insurance is \$9,500 for 2007 which is an 8% increase plus \$300 over last year.

The balance will show that we have a good cash flow and that our investments are riding up or down along with the market.

### **Jr. Warden's Report**

Jim White, Jr. Warden reported that he is going to put a non-slip surface on the new handicap ramp.

### **Old Business**

Thank you to Rodney Paul for the recent work day. As usual, things went very well and much was accomplished.

### **New Business**

It was announced that Stephanie Smith is resigning from her position as organist.

Stephanie has taken a job with University Lutheran Church in Gainesville. The ECW will hold a farewell reception for Stephanie following the 11:00 service on April 22<sup>nd</sup>.

On June 6<sup>th</sup> we will hold our first joint service. We will continue to hold only one joint service on the First Sunday of every month.

Jack Rice suggested that the floor in the kitchen will soon need repair.

Donna Eichelsderfer announced that the Italian Night Dinner will be held on Friday, April 27<sup>th</sup>. Tickets will be \$10.00 per person and we will also be advertising the dinner to our local community. "Take-out" dinners will also be available.

Clay O'Neal said that Vacation Bible School will be held the last week of July this year.

It will have a cowboy theme and the name of it is "Avalanche Ranch". He will be looking for volunteers and getting things ready over the next few weeks.

The meeting was adjourned with a prayer. Linda Wilcox, Clerk

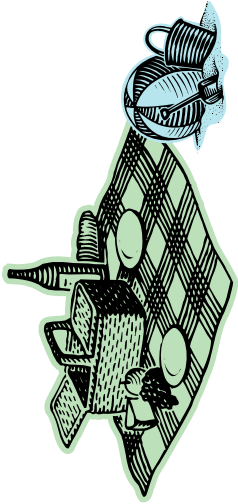
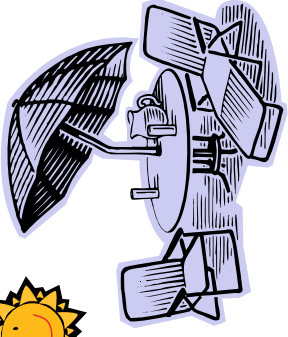
"I didn't ask for any details," the lawyer interrupted. "Just answer the question. Did you not say, at the scene of the accident, 'Thank God, I'm fine'?"

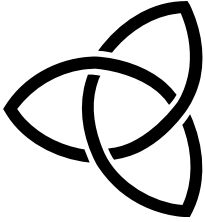

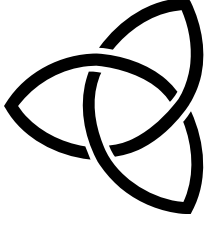

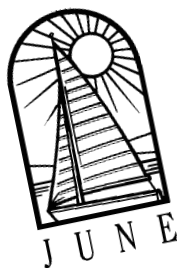
