

## SEDER DINNER

This Maundy Thursday, March 24th, we will have a symbolic Seder Dinner just prior to the service. It will not be a full meal but will be a representation of the retelling of the story of the liberation of the Israelites from slavery in ancient Egypt. This story is in The Book of Exodus in The Hebrew Bible. One of the ritual elements of the meal is to eat it on brightly colored plates. We don't have many of those in the kitchen so if you will bring your own (there are some in the Thrift Shop) and then take it home after the meal, it should make for very interesting table settings! There are several parts of the meal including a hard boiled egg, roasted lamb, and matzo. Four (very small) glasses of wine are drunk symbolizing the four promises of the redemption. We will have information available for everyone on what each item symbolizes. You might like to read Exodus before the dinner for a little extra insight. If you would like to take part in the Seder Dinner, please sign up on the list so we will know how many to prepare for and how many places to set.
