This Wednesday, February 10, is Ash Wednesday, a solemn day of prayer and fasting that marks the beginning of Lent.

Pastor Ken Collins reminds us, "Lent is a season of soul-searching and repentance. It is a season for reflection and taking stock. Lent originated in the very earliest days of the Church as a preparatory time for Easter, when the faithful rededicated themselves and when converts were instructed in the faith and prepared for baptism. By observing the forty days of Lent, the individual Christian imitates Jesus' withdrawal into the wilderness for forty days. All churches that have a continuous history extending before AD 1500 observe Lent. The ancient church that wrote, collected, canonized, and propagated the New Testament also observed Lent, believing it to be a commandment from the apostles. (See *The Apostolic Constitutions*, Book V, Section III.)"

I invite you, therefore, to prepare for the penitent season with one last meal of delicious pork and pancakes! Troop 109 will be hosting the Annual Pancake Supper here at Trinity. The Audubon Society is assisting this year in hopes that you might join them afterward for an delightful presentation on Horseshoe Crabs and their contribution to medical science.

I invite you to come for the imposition of ashes on Wednesday at 12 noon and 6 p.m., entering into the Lenten season expecting God to touch you through the mighty power of his healing and forgiveness.
