Dear Trinity Family,

On Tuesday mornings at Keystone UMC, a number of men from local churches meet to pray for the Lake Area community. Five or six of our own regularly attend. Ken reads and comments on the appointed Psalm, while Will and I lead a hymn and the Doxology to close out the hour.

Each week a devotional is given by one of the men. This week’s subject addressed how we speak – the importance of words - what we say in our conversations and how we speak to others.

A search of Holy Scripture reveals many verses on the subject. Paul writes in Ephesians, “Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear.” Our words to others should be encouraging; building up, not tearing down. How many children have struggled in life because their parents said, “You’re no good! You won’t amount to anything!”

The Apostle James says, “With the tongue we bless our Lord and Father, and with it we curse people who are made in the likeness of God. From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers, these things ought not to be so.” We see this on television, the Internet, Facebook and Twitter, and unfortunately, even in Church, how often we hear people speak ill of others.

There is such hatred in our culture today – vile words spoken along ideological and party lines without full understanding or compassion. We often lash out at others without thought or concern to the person and the harm our words can do.

Paul says in Thessalonians, “Speak encouraging words to one another. Build up hope so you’ll all be together in this, no one left out, no one left behind. I know you are already doing this; just keep doing it.” In this morning’s sermon, we will look deeper into the meaning of God’s Word and what is expected of us as God’s children – the importance of speaking hope even into the darkest situation.
