Dear Trinity Family,

Monday evening at Home Fellowship we found a rare gem in the 15th chapter of 1 Corinthians. There among Paul's defense of the Resurrection, we discover a wonderful synopsis of the apostolic faith. Paul writes, "I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; and that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures." Christ died for our sins, was buried, and rose again! Amen! The Good News! The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ!

You and I hear those words each Sunday as we recall our faith in the Nicene Creed: "For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures."

There are many creedal statements in the New Testament, which allow us to see and experience the wisdom and revelation that shaped the beliefs of the early church and shape our own faith today.

Who was Jesus? Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." Matt. 16.16

What is Christ's relation to God? John writes, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." John 1.1-4 NIV

What is the Incarnation? John answers, "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth. He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not." John 1.14;10 KJV

What is our relationship with Christ? "But as many as received him, to them he gave power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name: Which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God." John 1.12 KJV

How can we be sure that we are saved? "That if you shall confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus, and shall believe in your heart that God has raised him from the dead, you shall be saved. For with the heart man believes unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation." Romans 10.9-10

This is just a sampling of Holy Scripture that reveal the depths and mystery of our incarnate faith. As Paul says in 1 Timothy 3.16, "God was
