Dear Trinity Family,

I've heard, on more than one occasion and from members I trust and respect that there are cliques at Trinity. "Say it ain't so!" I thought, but still there are folks who visit Trinity, who join Trinity, who contribute time, talent, and money to Trinity who still wonder if they belong.

Ann and I joined Ascension Episcopal in Dr. Phillips, Orlando in the early 1980's – a young couple with two young boys coming to a relatively new church in town. As much as we attended, and gave our energy and heart to that church, we still didn't quite belong, weren't quite accepted. It took years to truly belong, to be in the circle. Human nature? Perhaps, but it still hurts, even a tinge, when one is not fully welcomed and accepted.

Cliques are difficult to overcome. Even Jesus had an inner circle among the Twelve: Peter, James, and John. And the Twelve were notorious for trying to keep people from seeing Jesus. On more than one occasion he rebuked the disciples and let the little ones come to him.

Often I hear a parishioner say, "You're so busy, I don't want to bother you." Later I learn you were in the hospital, or sick, troubled, or grieving. My door is always open! Please come by or call me and let me know so we can pray.

There are groups within the Church who are more connected than others. Ann and I learned early that if you are not on the Vestry, you are pretty oblivious to all that is going on. Stepping off Vestry is like stepping into a black hole, an information void. Leadership is one clique that cannot be avoided; an inner circle of members who need to be open, sharing, and caring with everyone.

Another group that hangs together regularly is the choir and the musicians. We are an artsy bunch and are blessed to do what we love. And yes, you are invited! Bring your voice, your guitar, your kazoo! Come and join us!

There are several other groups in the Church who could become cliquish – Altar Guild, DOK, ECW, Sister's Circle, and the Men's Club. It is important that we all watch our behavior when participating in these groups, especially at functions open to the public.

While most of us would deny that we've ever been a part of a clique or turned someone away, truth is it happens more than we would want to admit. Do you lean your chair against the table to save a spot with your friends? Do you sit at the same table with the same faces on First Sunday?

Or, do you seek out the newcomers and ask them to sit with you? Do you feel comfortable sitting next to a visitor and helping them find their way in the Prayer Book? Becoming, being, the warm, welcoming Church we want to be takes a lot of effort! Please take time to greet our visitors and welcome newcomers into Trinity's family. Let's make sure everyone knows they are welcome and make them feel right at home.
