Dear Trinity Family

“O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie, above thy deep and dreamless sleep, the silent stars go by. Yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting Light. The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight” The tiny town of Bethlehem plays an important part in God’s salvation story.

Bethlehem is first mentioned in Genesis, in the thirty-fifth chapter, when God commands Jacob, “Go up to Bethel and settle there, and build an altar there to God.” So Jacob said to his household and to all who were with him, “Get rid of the foreign gods you have with you, and purify yourselves and change your clothes. Then come, let us go up to Bethel, where I will build an altar to God, who answered me in the day of my distress and who has been with me wherever I have gone.” So they gave Jacob all the foreign gods they had and the rings in their ears, and Jacob buried them under the oak at Shechem.

What a wonderful image for the journey of Advent, a time to get rid of our foreign gods, purify ourselves, and put on new clothes – the clothes of Christ, the clothes of salvation. Exactly what John demands of us today as he proclaims the baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, washing away the old and putting on the new.

It is here at Bethlehem God changed Jacob’s name to Israel: “After Jacob returned from Paddan Aram, God appeared to him again and blessed him. God said to him, ‘Your name is Jacob, but you will no longer be called Jacob; your name will be Israel.’ So he named him Israel.”

In the words of a popular worship song, God says to us, “I will change your name. You shall no longer be called wounded, outcast, lonely or afraid. I will change your name. Your new name shall be confidence, joyfulness, overcoming one. Faithfulness, friend of God, one who seeks My face.” That’s the relationship God wants for each of us, and the very reason for the Incarnation, the blessed birth of His Son.

This Advent we look forward to the birth of our Savior, our Redeemer. Amen.
