Dear Trinity Family,

Why do we have pink candle today? Well, actually it's rose colored, as are the altar and lectern coverings, which remind us that the Third Sunday in Advent is Gaudete (gowDETeh) Sunday. The rather odd name is taken from the first word in the traditional Latin Introit, *Gaudete* means "Rejoice!" *Gaudete in Domino semper: iterum dico, gaudete* – "Rejoice in the Lord always, and again I say rejoice!"

Originally a penitential season, Advent is a 40 day fast kept in preparation for Christmas. However, the Church takes a break on this Third Sunday, moving the focus from the penitential nature of Advent towards the joy and promise of Jesus' coming, looking forward to Christmas and the birth of our Lord.

For those who are counting candles, the rose candle serves as a warning – there is only one week, one candle, one Advent Sunday left until Christmas!

"On a more serious note, please pray for the persecuted Church. Pastor John Cao, a US permanent resident, spent 3 years routinely crossing from China into Myanmar (Burma), establishing schools and house churches. He kept his Chinese citizenship but is married to an American and lives in the US. In March 2017 he was arrested and sentenced to 7 years in prison. Living in a crowded cell, he has lost 50 pounds and is suffering from health issues. Please pray for his release, and for his family in NC. Tony+
