

FRONT DOOR MINISTRY

The Outreach Committee would appreciate any assistance you might be able to help us with for the Front Door Ministry. It's purpose is to help those people in need who come to our "front door" needing food.

Through this ministry we are able to give out bags of food which can feed a family of two or four for 24 hours. We are not equipped with a large food pantry but we don't want anyone to have to go away with hungry children or hungry themselves. Sometimes these people are homeless and other times they are just not able to make enough income to sustain their families. We are able to give them some food and information and directions to LAM or Fourth Friday in Interlachen and Father Tony also talks with them about other needs they may have and their current circumstances. The food we are able to give them is a temporary but necessary stop gap until they can get to one of the other churches where they can be given large bags of groceries.

We are blessed to be able to give what we have but during the holidays we gave out a great many bags and are currently running low on supplies. If you are able to donate any of the items below or to make a financial donation to the front door ministry it will enable us to continue helping. If you are unable to bring any of the items then perhaps you can spend a bit of time in prayer for those who are being helped, that is just as great a gift. You can bring your items to the church or to the office. Thanks you very much for your love and care.

Cans of things like spaghetti, beanie weenies etc with pop tops

Peanut butter or cheese filled crackers

Tuna or chicken salad kits with crackers

Nutrition Bars

Small cups of fruit

Dried Beef sticks like Slim Jims

Cups of Oatmeal that just need water added

Small cups of pudding or Jello

We try to have as many items which have some protein and all items which will not need a can opener, or stove. We also include plastic ware with salt and pepper and a napkin.

Dear Trinity Family,

This past Monday diocesan clergy and spouses gathered at St. John's Cathedral in Jacksonville to enjoy a conversation and luncheon with Presiding Bishop Michael Curry. This was not a time for deep theological discussion, but more of a welcoming, reminiscing conversation about the Bishop's past, a bit of information about his family and home in North Carolina, and his recollection of the invitation and events leading up to his preaching at the Royal Wedding.

Bishop Curry addressed a few previously submitted questions, including his experience at the Royal Wedding, and his love for the violin (he says he does not play, he practices. In fact, he once raised money for charity just by threatening to play.)

Concerning the divisive decisions made at General Convention concerning same-sex marriage, Bishop Curry reiterated the need for continued conversation and transparency. He supported Bishop Howard, who has requested in our Diocese to personally meet with the priest and wardens before proceeding.

Bishop Curry shared about his devotional life, admitting that it is not always perfect, but for him, the secret is getting up early each morning, spending time in scripture and prayer. Our Presiding Bishop leads by example. He is a man committed to personal devotion and prayer.

Sitting in the pews of St. John's Cathedral, hearing the conversation between Bishop Howard and Bishop Curry, left me with an awesome glimpse of God's Kingdom. In spite of their differences, they are brothers in Christ, able to sit down and have a conversation, and share the love of Christ.
