Then came the vision and the miracles that made it all happen! (There's that word again!) Land was given, the building was renovated, the doors opened and the shelves were filled – all in unexpected ways, through volunteers and donations and God's grace overflowing!

Joan told the story of receiving a case of special baby formula which she graciously accepted, though they had no plans as yet to give out formula and didn't really know what to do with it. That very afternoon a young mother showed up in dire need of that very brand and type of formula for her baby. It was a God send!

Joan has so many stories like this to share; she could have kept us there for hours. Reminds me of John's Gospel, when he said, "Jesus performed many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book."

God is alive and well and working in the Lake Area – not only at LAM, but here at Trinity, and Melrose, and all our fellow churches and ministries. Take heart, God is happening here! In our church, our community, and our Diocese.

Tuesday at Marywood Retreat Center, The Rev. Canon Allison DeFoor shared his passion for Prison ministry and the faith based initiatives, like Kairos, that are changing lives of prisoners and helping to keep them from returning to jail once they are out.
