Dear Trinity Family

I'm passing this along to you from Cinnie, it was found among the collections of the late Rosemary Daurer:

"The King James Version of the Bible has been enormously influential in the development of the English language. It is said to rank with the works of Shakespeare and the Oxford English Dictionary as cornerstones of the recorded language. After Shakespeare, the King James, or Authorized, version of the Bible is the most common source of English phrases."

Commissioned or "Authorized" by James I of England (also known as James VI of Scotland), the King James Version of the Bible was translated from the original tongues of Greek, Hebrew, and Aramaic, using the oldest and most authentic manuscripts available at the time. The translations were begun in 1604 with 47 scholars working in six committees, and completed in 1611, the King James Version is revered for its majestic style.

Some 400 years after its first publication, the King James Version is still, by far, the most used and accepted version among Christians. During a 2017 Statista survey, 31% of the respondents said they read the KJV. The New International Version (NIV) came in second at 13%, with the English Standard Version, the New King James Version, and the Amplified Version coming in at 3rd, 4th, and 5th place.

What raises the King James Version above others is the linguistic impact that has persisted into the present day. Many of the phrases used are still commonplace. Here are just a few of the phrases which are still used today.

Warmly, Tony+

Out of the mouths of babes.

Born Again.

Bottomless pit.

In the twinkling of an eye.

God forbid.

Scapegoat

Signs of the times.

A leopard changes his spots.

White as snow.

Blind leading the blind.

The spirit is willing but the flesh is weak!
