Dear Trinity Family,

We’re blessed to have Fr. George celebrate the Eucharist today. Ann and I are taking a break at the beach. Please pray the storm will stay away.

Next Sunday, September 8th, we begin our fall season with the return to two services at 8:30 and 11:00 a.m. The early service will feature your favorite hymns and contemporary praise and worship songs.

For those who prefer traditional Episcopal hymns, we are grateful to have Margaret Rice and the Choir lead us at the 11 o’clock service. Looking forward to wonderful worship at both services.

Sunday school will continue between the services. And our Tuesday study will begin again at 1:30, on the 10th, featuring a new DVD presentation from Ray Vander Laan’s “That the World May Know” videos. These are excellent video presentations filmed on-site in the places where Jesus and the Apostles walked and taught.

There will be a small change in worship this fall and move the announcements to the beginning of the service, before we begin worship. This is something we will try for a season to see if it helps the flow of the service. I’m sure it will seem a bit awkward the first week or two; however, we are hoping to provide more meaningful worship by removing the big break in the middle.

Another area that is like a time-out during the service is the passing of the Peace, which comes immediately after confession and the absolution. The Peace has roots in the ancient customs of the Jews and the early church. The Hebrew word *shalom*, or peace, is a rich word that conveys wellness, harmony, and wholeness. The passing of the peace is not meant to be a meet and greet, but a time to make relationships whole again.

Jesus said in Matthew, “Therefore if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar. First go and be reconciled to your brother; then come and offer your gift.”

The passing of the peace is a time to reconcile with our neighbor, to go to one we may have hurt or offended and make peace with that person. The peace is also a great time to reach out and greet those who are new to the parish. So if you see a new face, or someone whose name slips your memory, take a moment and greet them.
