CHANGE! That word is often scarier than Evangelism. Humans don't like change. We are creatures of habit. And as we grow towards the age of wisdom, I find it harder to step away from the familiar.

That's why I marvel at how well you have received Jonathan and the energy he brings to our music and our worship. The responses to the surveys and the comments as we leave church have been overwhelmingly positive!

There have been some very good questions and constructive criticisms; however, I believe most of those concerns will work themselves out in time. For that, we are very grateful for your patience. For example, James, the organ repairman, can't be here for another week or so to address the sticking keys. Jonathan cannot make full use of the organ until it is fixed.

We are also thankful to have Margaret and the choir back! The choir is rehearsing weekly, practicing hymns and anthems for the 11 o'clock worship. Our Episcopal hymns and the anthems are all new to Jonathan, so naturally, it will take some time for learning and adjustments.

One of the biggest requests is for more quiet time before and during the service. Last Sunday at the first service, we sat in silence for a period, then stood and sang Michael W. Smith's "Agnus Dei" as our opening hymn. Very powerful, spontaneous worship! And a bit outside our order of worship. We will look at ways to integrate the two, allowing for phenomenal worship without compromising our Episcopal liturgy.

Change can be difficult, but with your prayer and understanding, change can lead us deeper into worship and draw us closer to God. So please join me in putting on your patience cap as we work out the wrinkles and fine-tune our worship on Sundays.
